Known as Dilmun in ancient times, Bahrain's rich trading history is reflected in numerous archaeological sites, the most fascinating of which is the Bahrain Fort site that is registered as a UNESCO World Heritage site. The fort is located atop a 17.5 hectare artificial hill that has been built over more than 4000 years of continuous occupation. It is the site of the former capital of Dilmun and one of the most archaeological sites in the Arabian Gulf. The excavations over the past 50 years have revealed residential, public, commercial and military structures that testify to the importance of the site over the centuries. These findings are brought to life by an audio guide available at the site museum. The site museum display area consists of 5 exhibition halls organized around

a massive Tell Wall. With 500 artefacts showcased, the long settlement history of the site is evoked to the unique backdrop of the wall. The seaside café of the museum offers a stunning view of the fort and the surrounding palm groves.

Even if you are not a motor racing fan you will be caught up in the thrill and excitement of the planet's biggest racing event, Formula One, that has been an annual part of Bahrain's sporting scene since April 2004. Bahrain's Grand Prix made history as the first Formula One Grand Prix to be held in the Middle East

and was awarded the "Best Organized Grand Prix" by FIA. Even when Formula One is not taking center stage at the Bahrain International Circuit, visitors can take the wheel themselves on its state-of-the-art karting track or enjoy a thrilling ride in the passenger seat of a Hummer on its Extreme 4x4 course. Of course, a visit to the circuit is a must so as not to miss the opportunity to test drive a race car on the track itself.









The Bahrain National Museum is the crowning achievement of the Kingdom of Bahrain's ongoing efforts to preserve the nation's heritage and history; Efforts which began in 1957 when the first exhibition of the artefacts discovered by the Danish archaeological expedition was held at Al-Hidaya Al-Khalifiya in Muharrag. Built on a central location between Manama and Muharrag.

Bahrain National Theater opened in November 2012 under the patronage of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa. The theater hosted a number of global performances from some of the world's foremost artists, such as the Orchestra of the 21st Century of Russia, legendary composer Yanni, Spanish opera superstar Placido Domingo, the Bolshoi and Mariinsky Ballets from Russia, and Il Divo.

Bab Al Bahrain is located at the entrance to the Manama Souq in Bahrain's capital city Manama. Built in 1949 by Shaikh Salman Bin Ahmed Al Fateh, it once housed the government's administrative offices and overlooked the sea. Behind Bab Al Bahrain is the old Manama Souq. The souq is a vibrant collection of shops offering a wide range of goods from textiles, spices, incense, perfumes, handicrafts and souvenirs, as well as more modern products from all over the world. There are also a number of traditional coffee shops. The Manama Soug is a must visit while in Bahrain that visitors will be sure to enjoy.

The heritage site "Pearling, Testimony of an Island Economy" relates the exciting story of Bahrain's pearling era through historic places ranging from urban heritage elements and a well-preserved authentic seashore

to pearl-producing oyster beds. Conservation works have been ongoing in the site since 2011. As of today, the conservation works of Qal'at Bu Maher, Al Ghus House and Nukhidhah House are completed and the buildings are open to public visits. You are strongly encouraged to start your visit with the Bu Maher Fort and Bu Maher Interpretative Centre to get an overall idea of the World Heritage Site components. Please be informed that the visits to

Bu Maher Fort, Bu Maher seashore and the interpretative centre is possible from the National Museum of Bahrain via boat leaving every half hour be-

tween the hours of 8.00 am to 5.00pm.

Al Ghus House is open to visit since 2015 with an exhibition that sheds light on the daily life of low-income actors of the pearling economy, pearl divers and haulers. Nukhidhah House is a must visit to experience the living space of the captain's profession.

Currently, the remaining urban components of the World Heritage Site of Pearling are included in a conservation and urban revival project. The project is proceeding in a multifaceted way consisting of three major interventions in the areas of conservation, urban renewal and visitor facilities. A set of mobility and traffic arrangements are encompassed in the scope of the project as well.

Muharraq, the former capital of Bahrain, is known for its cultural contributions through the many restored traditional Bahraini houses that can be found amidst the narrow lanes and byways. The Sheikh Isa bin Ali House is Bahrain's most impressive example of Gulf Islamic architecture featuring four court-yards, beautifully carved wooden doors, and perforated gypsum panels.

The Shaikh Ebrahim Bin Mohamed Al Khalifa Center for Culture and Research provides an important insight into several particularly interesting aspects of Bahrain's heritage. From embroidery at Kurar House to a splendid showcase of Bahrain's pearling history at the Bin Mattar House, the former home of a renowned pearl merchant, the various houses reflect Shaikh Ebrahim Center's commitment towards preservation of both traditional architect and history.

The collection of houses include the Shaikh Ebrahim Lecture Hall, Iqra Children's Library, Heraf al Diyar, Nukhida House (the first house to be restored along the Pearling Path), Kurar House, Abdullah al Zayed House and Bin Matar House, Bu Zaboon House, Mohammed bin Faris House that all showcase different aspects of Bahrain's rich heritage.

The collection of houses include the Sheikh Ebrahim Lecture Hall, Iqra Children's Library, Heraf al Diyar, Nukhida House (the first house to be restored along the Pearling Path), Kurar House, Abdullah al Zayed House, Bin Matar House, Bu Zaboon House and Mohammed bin Faris House that all showcase different aspects of Bahrain's rich heritage.

One of the oldest markets of Muharrag market, Al Qaisariya Soug features a range of shops that sell a variety of products and trade goods ranging from pearls to spices and teas. Al Qaisariya Soug is part of the Pearling Path "Pearling, Testimony to an Island Economy" - UNESCO World Heritage Site.







Located in the heart of Manama, Block 338 is a charming pedestrian quarter crammed with international restaurants art galleries and boutique shops. As Bahrain's hot dining district, Block 338 offers a wide range of restaurants appealing to all ages and taste, be it for a fancy meal, traditional Bahraini food or just a soothing drink. In addition to this distinguished eating experience, Block

338 has a number of good retail opportunities tucked into its side streets and

has grown over the years into a vibrant space for art lovers.





Housed in a building spectacularly engraved with Arabic script, Beit al Quran (House of Quran) showcases a fascinating collection of Quranic manuscripts as well as a library of over 50,000 books written in Arabic, English, and French that center mostly on Islam. Manuscripts dating back to the 7th century as well as Qurans written on parchment, rice, peas, and grains are among the impressive collection. It is claimed to be the only institute in the world devoted to the Quran.

The building also houses a mosque, an auditorium, a madrasa (religious

school, a museum, and hosts a variety of art exhibitions.









Commonly known as Riffa Fort due to its location, is a historic landmark and stands witness to one of the most important junctures in Bahrain's history. The fort presents a chronological history of the Al Khalifa family and showcases the interior space designed by the French firm, La Meduse and the local engineering firm, PAD, which took its inspiration from the fort's history and people. The fort also houses the Saffron Café, which overlooks the picturesque Al-Haniniya Valley.

Sunday - Wednesday 7:00am - 2:00pm Thursday and Saturday 9:00am -6:00pm, Friday 3:00 - 6:00pm

The museum features 11 themed halls, houses paintings, documents and photos documenting the history of Bahrain's military and the Defence Force, and also displays the flags and weaponry of various BDF units.

The village of Al Jasra offers a look into the traditional arts and crafts that many of the villages in Bahrain have historically produced. Al Jasra Handicrafts Center showcases pottery making, cloth weaving, wood working,

basket weaving, and sadow making that are created using the traditional

methods. Located in the village of Al Jasra, Beit Al Jasra (Jasra House) is a traditional style house built in 1907. It was restored in 1986 using original building materials such as coral stones and palm leaf trunks.

The grand Al Fateh Mosque is both Bahrain's largest place of worship and among one of the largest mosques in the world.

It was built under the patronage of the late Shaikh Isa bin Salman Al Khalifa in 1987 and was named after Ahmed Al Fateh. The mosque accommodates up to 7000 worshippers and is crowned with the largest fiberglass dome in the world. The walls of the mosque are beautifully ornamented with Kufic calligraphy.

Next to the mosque is the Shaikh Isa Culture Chyventre & National Library.

An exciting world-class adventure. For more than 2000 years Bahrain's pearls have been prized as some of the best natural pearls in the world! In the past pearl divers went out to sea for months. They were lowered on weighted ropes and remained underwater for a minute with nothing but a nose peg to control their breathing. Now, we offer you the opportunity to hunt for pearls right here in the pleasant waters of the Gulf.

Steps: 1. Get a ticket online at www.btea.bh 2. Attend a briefing workshop

3. Departure from Ras Rayyah with a licensed company

4. Collect up to 60 oysters

5. Open your oysters on the boat and on the return trip

6. Have your pearls appraised for value and quality.













Bu Maher Fort is located in the south of the city of Muharraq, and was first built during the Portuguese occupation of Bahrain. Renovation works on the fort commenced in the 1970's, during which only some of it was rebuilt. In 2010, excavation works carried work at the site uncovered its original foundations and dimensions. The fort represents the first step on Pearling Trail, inscribed as a World Heritage Site in 2012. A dedicated visitor center was es-

Strategically located as a sea passage, Arad fort is a typical example of Omani military architecture at the end of the 15th and early 16th centuries. This fort was once the site of fierce battles and underwent different construction phases. All though it is not clear when it was constructed it has played a major role in the defense of Bahrain against marauders through the centuries. It was restored in the 1980s using only authentic material. It is nicely illuminated at night and hosts seasonal festivals throughout the year.

Horses have been a highly respected part of Bahrain's culture for generations, playing an important part in the daily life of the community. The love of horses is seen clearly on Friday afternoons on the northern coast of Bahrain when horses are ridden at Bahrain fort and on the beach of Nuwrana just west of Kurana village.

The Barbar complex consists of three successive temples built over 5 stages and dating back to the 2nd and 3rd millennium BC. They were built on platforms and organized around a courtyard.
